



Instructions on Filling out Application for Flight Scholarship:



1. The name, address and phone number section is fairly strait forward. So, fill this out with the proper information including your birth date.
2. The age section is important to NWAAC to determine the eligibility and urgency of qualified applicants.
3. If you are in school or college the school section is to be filled out for possible verification of enrollment. The phone number here should be the registrar's office. This is the same for a high school, college or trade school.
4. Fill in the flight school, FBO - Fixed Base Operator or CFI – Certified Flight Instructor you are intending to use. This is so that NWAAC can coordinate on progress, program or other issues with the instructor or outfit. If you do not have one, that can be discussed with the NWAAC Scholarship Committee and a recommendation can be made.
5. Attach a copy of your successful FAA written exam test results or be able to present one within 90 days from the date of being notified of approval for the scholarship.
6. Attach a copy of your successful FAA Third Class Medical or be able to present one within 90 days from the date of being notified for approval of the scholarship.
7. Indicate your fields of interest you have in the type or types of flying by checking the appropriate boxes. The "other" box could be for example Airport Management, Air Traffic Control or A & P. The "other" box is to be in addition to one of the pilot certificates.
8. Write a 500 word essay on your interests in obtaining your private pilots certificate. This should be typed and be about one page in length.
9. Include letters of recommendation from people other than your parents that know your character and your interest in flying.
10. The recipient has one (1) year to get the solo endorsement and present it to the scholarship committee. If not the recipient needs to re-apply for the scholarship.
